KEEPING CHICKENS

Homeowner Association Covenants

- Before proceeding with registration, each applicant should determine whether his or her property is subject to homeowner's association covenants, conditions, or restrictions and whether such restrictions would allow chickens.

- **The number of hens** (female chickens) allowed on single family residential lots is based on the lot size, as follows:

Minimum Lot Size	Maximum Number of Hens Allowed
10,000 square feet	6
20,000 square feet	8
40,000 square feet	10
80,000 square feet	12
200,000 square feet	No Limit, if AG Exempt

- **Chicken Coop**
 - Maximum height 8 feet
 - Minimum 3 square feet per hen
- **Chicken Yard**
 - Chickens must have access to an enclosed chicken yard.
 - Wire mesh fencing materials must retain a flat and uniform plane.
- **Street Setbacks**
 - Chicken coops and yards may not be located between the dwelling and any improved road right-of-way or access easement.
- **Side and Rear Yard Setbacks**
 - Chicken coops must meet all required rear and side yard setbacks for accessory structures.
- **Setbacks to Neighboring Structures**
 - Minimum 30 feet away from existing fixed structures on any adjoining parcel (not including storage structures such as garages or sheds)
- **Management Practices**
 - Roosters are NOT allowed on properties less than 200,000 square-feet in size.
 - Hens may be allowed to roam within a fenced back yard, but not outside of the fenced yard
 - Coops must be covered with uniform materials and be maintained intact with all parts secure.
