Grants for Small Businesses

The Lake County Board invites small businesses in Lake County that have been negatively impacted by COVID-19 to apply online for grants of up to \$30,000 to help cover rent or mortgage payments, utility costs and other expenses. A total of \$10 million is allocated to be awarded through this program. The application deadline is July 20. To learn more about this program and to apply, visit lakecountyil.gov/forward.



Financial Help for Residents

To date, the County Board has allocated \$5 million for rental and utility assistance and \$2 million for food needs throughout the county. Residents may soon apply for assistance through local social service organizations and townships.
