



Johnson & Johnson COVID-19 Vaccine

The Johnson & Johnson (J&J) COVID-19 vaccine is safe and effective—just like other vaccine brands.



All three vaccines help prevent:



Serious illness



Needing to go to the hospital



Death from COVID-19

COVID-19 vaccines do not contain any fetal cells.

They cannot give you COVID-19.

They also cannot harm your DNA.

What to expect after you get the vaccine:



Most people have mild side effects after getting any COVID-19 vaccine. This might include a sore arm or feeling tired for a day or two.

Your risk of a serious side effect from the vaccine is very low. Your risk of illness or death from COVID-19 is much higher.

Millions of people have gotten the J&J vaccine with no serious side effects. Very few people have had a rare blood clot after getting the J&J vaccine.



This risk is lower than 1 in 1 million for people ages 50 and older.

Women ages 18-49 had a slightly higher risk, about 7 in 1 million.

The risks of getting a blood clot from COVID-19 illness is about 165,000 in 1 million.
